#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

The 14th Annual Emergency symposium will be a cutting-edge action-packed course, addressing new directions and topics in emergency medicine. We will cover identifying atypical STEMI on electrocardiograms and examine newly approved reversal agents for anti-coagulants, paralytics and more.

This symposium will review diagnosis and management of the cyanotic neonate, current treatment options for fractures in trauma, new phone apps that will help you during your shift, and discuss the most up to date ACEP guidelines on pediatric fever work-up.

Presentations will also include discussion on ethical dilemmas in ED care, and what tools you are likely to have to provide care for an ill airline passenger in flight.

- Perform a femoral nerve block to significantly reduce pain levels for hip fracture patients

- Become familiar with signs which suggest potential human trafficking, and learn how to best approach these cases
- · Use cutting edge apps on your smartphone in real time to improve patient outcomes
- Utilize recently approved lifesaving medications to treat a bleeding patient on novel oral anticoagulants
- Demonstrate competence in identifying atypical strokes to improve rapid treatment and patient outcome
