

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The management of patients with Neurodegenerative Diseases like Parkinson's Disease, Multiple Sclerosis and Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis is complex, requiring a multi-disciplinary effort, ground-breaking research initiatives, and a person-centered focus to make an impact on the affected individual's quality of life. This conference will offer a platform for the exchange of ideas focusing on the management and needs of this population.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This educational activity will be designed to address the educational needs of: physicians and allied health practitioners who work with patients with neurodegenerative diagnoses throughout the trajectory of their illness. This conference will have a special focus on the rehabilitation needs of this population.

Instructional Method: Live Lecture and Discussion
